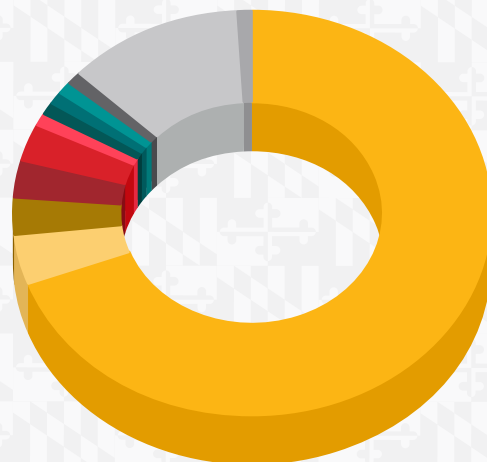
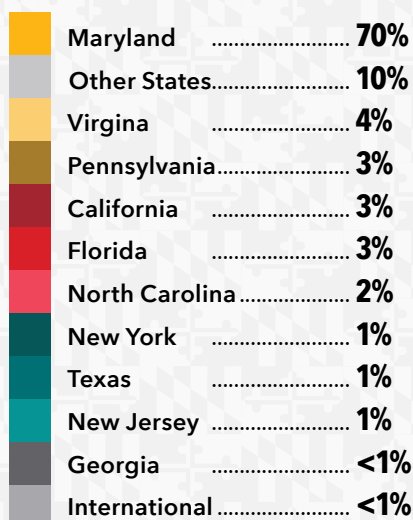

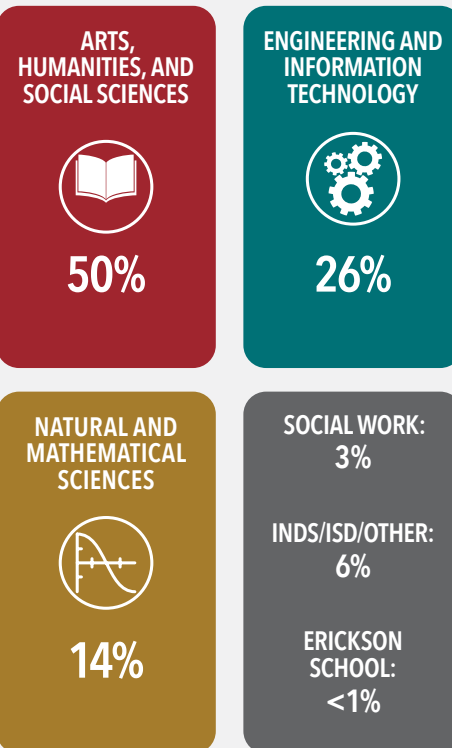

Geographic Distribution



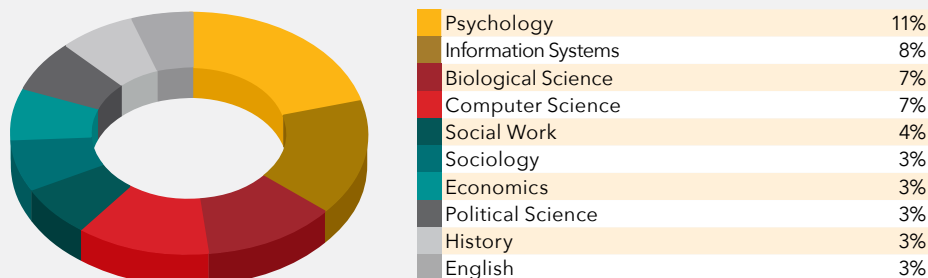
Alumni by College/School/Program⁴

Program Offerings

UMBC offers over 300 degrees and programs across three academic colleges (Arts, Humanities & Social Sciences; Engineering & Information Technology; Natural & Mathematical Sciences) and specialized schools like the Erickson School of Aging, the School of Social Work, and the School of Public Policy.
